 - Light Blue: Single- or multi-family houses **
 - Cyan: Mixed-use with retail or office
 - Brown: Public housing
- Other
- Light Purple: Non-residential buildings
 - Grey: No Data
 - White: Parking Lots
 - Green: Outdoor Athletics Uses
 - Dark Green: Parks and Open Space
 - Black Line: Railroad Line

* FSILG stands for Fraternity, Sorority, or Independent Living Group.
 ** Multi-family houses may be subdivided into condominium units.
